- In April we had our annual tire collection day where we collected 1185 tires from the community. Most were very old crappy tires that were pulled from the environment, so there was a lot of clean-ups done and a lot of mosquito habitat reduced.
- In April we also held our annual tree sale where we sold 955 native trees, 80 fruit trees, 57 bags of wildflower mix, 41 bags of compost, and 113 azaleas and rhododendrons.

- Now that Project Exile is nearly 15 years old, is it still a useful model for law enforcement executives to employ?
- Arends, Supervisory Special Agent, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives;

- Project Exile was, by most accounts, one of the most successful violent crime reduction strategies in the United States. The initiative started in February 1997 and was a coordinated effort between the Richmond Commonwealth Attorney's Office, Richmond Police Department (RPD), the U.S. Attorney's Office, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF), to target felons carrying firearms and prosecute them in federal court where they would receive stiffer sentences, no bail,

- and no early release. As a result, at the end of 1998, firearms-related homicides had decreased almost 40 percent in Richmond, Virginia.
- The Pennsylvania Democratic Representatives and Senators have introduced 75% of all Firearms legislation which has been all anti-gun legislation, <u>www.foac-illea.org</u> see 3rd tab from left LEGISLATION - Proposed State House Legislation & Proposed State Senate Legislation
- Why don't they try Project Exile and support the Police by having the Judges and District Attorneys enforce the current laws on the books to the fullest extent of the law. We currently have a state with "Crime without Punishment".
- In Summary it's not about politics it's about the 2nd Amendment of the United States
 Constitution and Article 1 Section 21 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, and which politicians will
 ignore these founding documents and infringe upon our Right to Keep and Bear Arms. The
