CWD CHANGES ANNOUNCED FOR 2024-25 SEASONS

 Disease Management Area 3 (DMA 3) will expand following the detection of CWD in a road-killed fawn in Armstrong County. DMA 3 is located in western Pennsylvania and includes portions of Armstrong, Cambria, Clarion, Clearfield, Elk, Indiana, and Jefferson counties.
