#### Local fish report:

Fishing is changing this time of year with cooler temps, but the fish are taking baits and can be very productive as the fish prepare for the winter months. Pay attention to bait fish migrations, creeks flowing into rivers, large water where temps are more stable, slow your reel speed and offer bigger bait.

State record this year in Ohio for hybrid striper 18.32 lbs. 31.75 inches, 24.5 girth. Previous 17.68 lbs., 31 inches.

#### Lake Erie Fishing:

The Steelhead fishermen are lining up on the shoreline by Elk and Walnut Creek. When the lake is calm the fishing can be pretty good. The rain will help the streams water level to rise some for a run, although aggressive fish will still move in lower water levels. They seem to be piling up in some holes north of Route 5. Anglers have been using single eggs, egg sacks, spoons and spinners which are taking most of the fish. As the water temps start to cool off it will trigger fish to migrate. Shore anglers are still catching some fish concentrating near creek mouths and channels in the bay.

# FOAC-ILLEA Secures Major Legal Victory Against City of Harrisburg

**Pittsburgh, PA** – Firearms Owners Against Crime - Institute for Legal Legislative and Education Action (FOAC-ILLEA) secured a major victory against The City of Harrisburg with a decision issued by Judge Andrew H. Dowling that enjoined the city's enforcement of several ordinances that unlawfully attempted to regulate firearms and ammunition. 5 of 10

"This decision is yet another validation of the preemption clause of the Pennsylvania Constitution and underscores the fact that no municipality may act contrary to state law," said Jim Stoker, FOAC-ILLEA President. "While justice was delayed in this case, with it taking more than nine years to be completed, FOAC-ILLEA is thrilled to have won yet another legal victory in defense of the Second Amendment." In January 2015, FOAC-ILLEA challenged the legality of several gun ordinances, seeking declaratory and injunctive relief against the city, its mayor, and the police chief. In his September 27, 2024, decision, Judge Dowling granted a permanent injunction enjoining the city's enforcement of four ordinances that attempt to unlawfully regulate firearms and ammunition.

The Harrisburg ordinances that were enjoined include an attempt to prohibit the discharge of a firearm within city limits unless at a firing range or an accredited educational facility approved by the mayor or chief of police; requiring a lawful gun owner to report any lost or stolen firearm within 48 hours; possession of firearms by minors; and prohibiting the possession, use, and discharge of firearms within city parks.

FOAC-ILLEA additionally challenged an ordinance that allowed for prohibitions on firearms and ammunition at any time the mayor was to declare a state of emergency in the city. Judge Dowling stopped short of ruling against Harrisburg on this ordinance, stating that the ordinance has never been triggered. In a footnote, Judge Dowling noted that if ever triggered with an emergency declaration, the ordinance would likewise be preempted.

"FOAC-ILLEA will always fight to uphold the Constitution of the United States and the Pennsylvania Constitution when there are challenges to the Second Amendment. We have successfully fought other local gun ordinances similar to those enacted by Harrisburg and will continue to make the case that an attempt to regulate firearms unconstitutionally infringes on rights conferred by the Second Amendment, the Pennsylvania Constitution, and are preempted by the Pennsylvania Uniform Firearms Act of 1995," Stoker continued.


