INFLUENZA SUSPECTED IN SNOW GOOSE MORTALITIES

- Avian influenza (AI) is suspected to have caused the deaths of about 200 snow geese found in the greater Allentown area.
- Those encountering other sick or dead wild birds can report them to the Pennsylvania Game Commission by calling 1-833-PGC-WILD (1-833-742-9453), by emailing pgc-wildlifehealth@pa.gov or by using the online [Wildlife Health Survey](#) tool.
- Any sick or dead domestic birds should be reported to Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture at 717-772-2852. If you have contact with sick or dead birds and are not feeling well, contact your primary care physician or the Pennsylvania Department of Health at 877-724-3258.

WINTER TURKEY SIGHTING SURVEY HAS BEGUN

- Pennsylvanians are encouraged to report the location of any turkey flocks they see across the state. Information is being collected online at <https://pgcdatacollection.pa.gov/TurkeyBroodSurvey> now through [March 15](#). Among other things, visitors to that webpage are asked to provide the date of the sighting, the location, and the type of land (public, private or unknown) where birds are seen.

PRELIMINARY 2025-26 SEASONS APPROVED

- The preliminary seasons and bag limits are nearly identical to those in place for 2024-25.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM COMMISSIONERS MEETING

- ELK LICENSE APPLICATION PROCESS COULD CHANGE
 - proposing to require hunters to first buy a hunting license before applying for an elk tag.
 - simplify the elk license application process, removing the requirement to include a hunter's Social Security number or hunter ID.
 - proposing to change the language describing how the drawing is conducted. When the description first was written, paper applications were literally drawn by hand from a rotating barrel. Now, tags are drawn electronically.
 - proposing to cap at 10% the number of elk licenses that can be awarded to nonresidents in any given year. Currently there is no limit, and while the percentage of tags going to nonresidents typically fell to 10%, it has increased in recent years to as high as 13%, which has drawn concern from residents.
 - proposing to limit hunters to draw one bull elk tag, total, in a lifetime.
- ADDITIONAL MENTORED OPPORTUNITIES TO BE EXPLORED
 - possibility of including mentored hunters in the in the "Ag Tag" program, as well as providing them opportunities to participate in the Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP)

PA Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) – Jeremy Allen

The 2025 Trout Stocking Schedules are now final and online. The PFBC will be stocking approximately 3.2 million adult trout in 691 streams and 130 lakes open for fishing across the state.

Statewide opening day of trout season: April 5, 2025 @ 0800am.

- It must be 7 inches, creel limit 5 per day.

Mentored Youth Day: March 29, 2026 @ 0800am-7:30pm

- Must be 7 inches, youth creel limit 2 trout.

Ice fishing season came and went here in Beaver County. We had a couple of solid weeks of good ice fishing. The ice conditions are deteriorating rapidly right now.

Anglers did well at Brady's Run Lake with trout and small Panfish. I observed many anglers including fishing Raccoon Lake mostly catching Panfish.

Looking at the forecast, ice fishing may be done for the year in Beaver County.

Approximately 20 cadets are at the HR Stackhouse school of fisheries and boating safety learning how to become Waterways Conservation Officers at this time. They will be coming out for field training at the end of March.

BCCD February Report

- 2025 Envirothon – The 2025 Beaver County Envirothon is scheduled for Wednesday, April 2nd at the lodge at Brady's Run. I will be finalizing team registrations this week, and as of right now, we are on track for the biggest Envirothon event yet. We have 1 new school district participating (Beaver Falls is sending 2 middle school teams this year) and we will have approximately 20 students more than we had last year.

- We will be in need of volunteers to help with the day of the event. We will need help serving food, running test scores from the stations to the scorekeepers, passing out shirts and registering students the day of the event, and more! - Rain Barrel Workshop – we are hosting our annual Storm Water Help for Homeowners workshop on Thursday, February 27th. This is an already filled-up event, we had all seats filled within 3 days of opening registrations! 40 households in Beaver County will get to learn about managing stormwater runoff at their homes and they will receive a kit to make their very own rain barrel.
- Spring Ag Workshop – We have our spring Ag workshop scheduled for Wednesday, March 5th. We are partnering with the Farm Service Agency to put on our biggest workshop yet. Penn State will be presenting for farmers and others to get their pesticide credits, FSA will be presenting on CREP for farmers, the district will have a display all about agriculture and ag conservation practices as well as a display on riparian buffers, 10 additional agricultural agencies will have tables set up to network with farmers in the area as well. Please consider joining us! Registration is requested so we have enough food and refreshments. Attached is a flyer with more details for registration.
- We will be holding our annual tree sale on April 26th. If you are interested in ordering any trees I have about 15 order forms here, you can also access the digital copy on our website.
- We have been approved for our grant for a tire collection day this spring through the Vector Borne Disease (West Nile Virus) program. The tentative date for that will be May 3, 2025, from 9 – 1. We are finalizing the details on that, and I will have more information next month. Legislative – Craig Holdren

Speaker – Jim Stoker

At the Great American Outdoor Show, the FOAC had a big role to play in it. FOAC leaders were invited to special events hosted by the National Rifle Association. Director Tichenor and I attended the ribbon cutting ceremony, where we spoke with NRA ILA Directors David Conte and Darin Goens, two workhorses in the Commonwealth fighting alongside us for all our gun rights. We also met with KRPA President and NRA Board Member Todd Ellis to discuss potential future joint endeavors, in addition to speaking with legislators like Sen. Cris Dush, journalists and others invested in the industry.

Understanding the political environment can be challenging. There is nobody in the 2A movement that wants to see Pennsylvania adopt Constitutional carry more than me. We would all be neck and neck at the front of that line pushing for what we know is best for our fellow citizens and our families. We would all love to see strengthening preemption go through, regardless of whether it is the House or the

Senate that pushes it. We all love to see the mental health system fixed instead of being used as leverage to attack our rights to bear arms. And I think we would all love to see an end to the seemingly endless parade of do-nothing anti-gun agenda driven bills that do nothing to stop crime or save lives but constantly push us to the defense of what “shall not be questioned.”

Sadly, we do not live in those times. We have a strong opposition basing their attacks on fear and lies to sell the moderate voting soccer mom that guns are evil, and we can stop evil people if we just take away a tool they use in a small percentage of their violence. Gun control is a multi-billion-dollar business that is not about saving lives but IS about raising money and votes. The Constitution and the founding of our nation lay largely forgotten beneath the fears of misinformed citizens.

We did not do great this past election cycle. Yes, at the national level pro-gun folks made great gains, but at the state level not so much. We are fortunate that we did get a pro-gun rights attorney general in Dave Sunday, but otherwise we remain on shaky ground. Down ballot voting did not pan out so well and the anti-gun crowd used scare tactics about abortion and other hot topics to stay one seat up in the House. We did not lose pro-gun legislators in the House the way some experts feared, but we did not secure it away from the anti-gun legislators either. We stayed, more or less, status quo.

That means we continue to fight. We must fight with an understanding of what expectations to have. The anti-gun agenda controls the House and the governor's seat. So, while they cannot press their will in defeating our Constitution past the Senate, we, also, cannot push our liberty loving restoration of our God given rights past them in the House or office of the governor. Trying to force it may result in losing ground rather than gaining, and we have to be smart as to what wins the war more than what wins small popularity contests. We have to be creative. We have to meet with the Game Commission to pursue strong gun rights policies there. We have to meet with AG Sunday and discuss the attorney general's role in enforcing the preemption statute against would be tyrants in small fiefdoms across the Commonwealth. And we have to raise funds to use litigation when necessary to straighten out those same violators when the Constitution demands it.

There is still plenty we can do. We will continue to fight for the rights of our fellow Pennsylvanians, making sure we are a voice that stops the anti-gun agenda being pushed upon our general assembly. And there is a lot we can still accomplish outside of those walls. Adapt. Improvise. Overcome.
