“Attention, local sportsmen’s organizations: The Pennsylvania Game Commission’s Shooting Range Improvement Program is accepting applications for shooting range projects, beginning April 1, 2025. The program seeks to provide funding to sportsmen clubs to develop new or unique projects that will positively impact Pennsylvania’s hunters and recreational shooters.

A maximum of \$50,000 will be awarded per project. Eligible projects could include Training, storage, and clubhouse facilities; new construction, renovation, relocation; construction of backstops and safety berms; signage; lead remediation; and more.

Submissions are due to the Game Commission by June 1, 2025. Projects are expected to be selected by July 1, 2025.

GAME COMMISSION APPLAUDS SUNDAY HUNTING BILL

- Sen. Dan Laughlin, R-Erie, this week reintroduced Senate Bill 67, which would end the state’s prohibition on Sunday hunting and allow the Game Commission to include Sundays when establishing hunting seasons annually.
- Many sportsmen’s groups back the initiative, as does the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau.

GAME COMMISSION RELEASES DEER HARVEST REPORTS

- Pennsylvania hunters harvested about 11% more deer in the 2024-25 hunting seasons than they did the year before. The statewide 2024-25 harvest is estimated at 476,880 deer, 175,280 of them antlered deer and 301,600 antlerless. By comparison, the statewide 2023-24 harvest was estimated at 430,010 deer.
- WMU 1A: 8,900 antlered (8,000), 16,600 antlerless (13,800).
WMU 2A: 8,800 antlered (10,000), and 13,800 antlerless (13,300).
WMU 2B: 8,000 antlered (7,000), and 14,300 antlerless (16,000).
